

Casey Robards The Intimacy of Musical Collaboration

At heart, we are chamber musicians who learn to marry our playing to another's in the most detailed and supportive way. We will talk about the specifics of how instrumentalists and singers experience breath and articulation, and how we can learn and practice these things as we develop collaborative skill. And, since real intimacy happens in an atmosphere of shared understanding and trust, we will also talk about how to communicate with our partners about what we need as pianists.

What's Your Tempo?

Playing for Musical Theatre Auditions

Playing for musical theatre auditions is a common gig that arises for collaborative pianists, but it requires a unique skill set that can be intimidating to many pianists. This presentation will break down the basic requirements to successfully work as an audition pianist for musical theatre.

Jiyeon Lee Exploring Korean Art Song: The Early Works of Isang Yun

This presentation examines three art songs by Korean composer Yun Isang from the perspective of the collaborative pianist. This will provide guidance on basic accompanying skills as well as insight into Yun's fusion of Korean and Western musical elements that will guide pianists to meaningful and well-informed interpretations.

Kathy Kelly The Bigger Picture: Improvisation, Sounding Like
Casey Robards an Orchestra and the Mystery of Conductors

Intimate we may be at heart, but much of the collaborative field is about standing in for an orchestra. That means dealing with orchestral reductions - which means learning to play what is not on the page - which just may lead to improvisation! We'll talk about how to practice sight reading and how to approach improvisation, and how those skills come to bear on tackling orchestral reductions. There will probably also be some conductor talk - you've been warned.

Yoshiko Arahata *The Pianist's Guide to Collaboration with Dance* Dance collaboration is a great gateway for pianists to deepen and broaden skills in music performance, sight-reading, improvisation, composition, and mastery of collaborations encompassing musicianship and broader interdisciplinary artistry. This presentation will explore methods of developing dance collaboration skills and how that can strengthen pianists' keyboard versatility and collaborative skills.

Creating a New Orchestral Reduction: Insights from the Sibelius Violin Concerto

This presentation addresses challenges in orchestral reductions, focusing on the Sibelius Violin Concerto. It critiques common flaws in published reductions and introduces a revised version that more accurately reflects the composer's intentions. Techniques for creating effective reductions and comparing existing scores will be discussed, aiming to enhance performance quality.

Robert Schumann's metronome markings in his chamber music with piano are often perplexing. This presentation explores the research into the markings' accuracy, the challenges each ensemble must address, and the approaches favored by current and past concert artists. 
Minjung Seo *Management of Collaborative Pianists*in University Settings

Despite their crucial contributions, collaborative pianists often face disparities in workload distribution compared to other faculty members. This presentation explores the management of full-time and part-time collaborative pianists within university settings.
